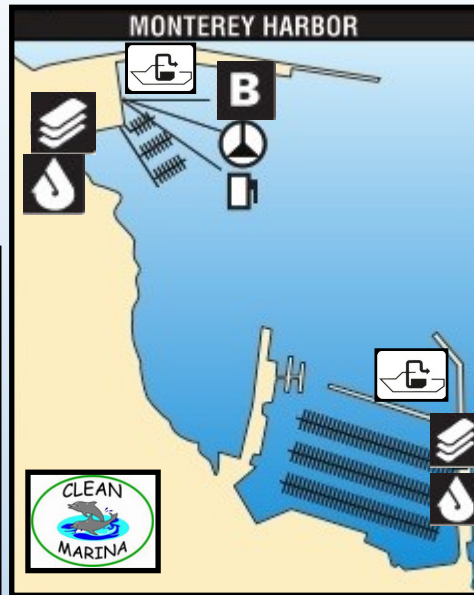
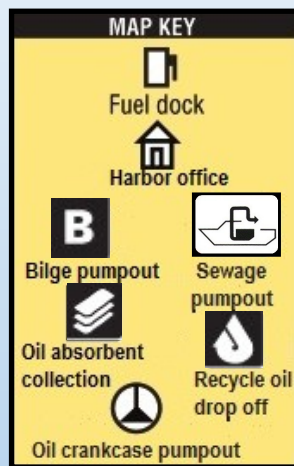

Clean Boating Tip #1

Prevent oil discharge from the bilge. Keep your engine well-tuned to prevent fuel and oil leaks. Secure an oil absorbent pad or pillow in your bilge and under your engine where drips may occur.

Clean Boating Tips #2-4

Spill-proof your oil changes. Use an oil change pump to transfer oil to a spill-proof container.

Limit fuel spills. Fill your tank slowly and use absorbent pads or rags to catch drips and spills.

Do not add soap. Avoid using soap to disperse fuel and oil spills.



**Clean Boating
Tips #5-7**

Minimize boat cleaning and maintenance in the water. If possible, save maintenance projects for the boatyard.

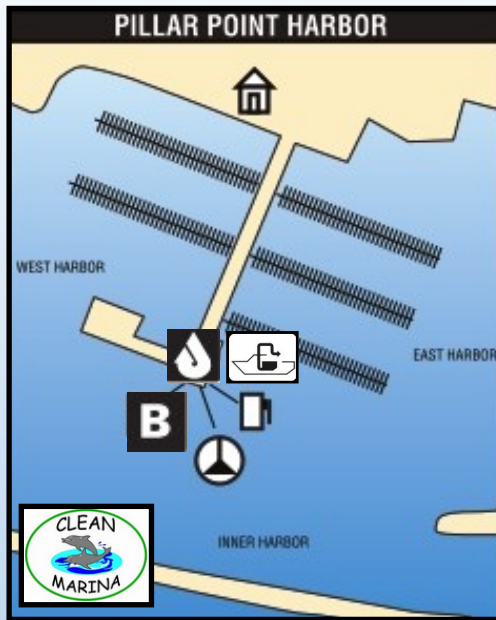
Reduce toxic discharges from bottom paints. Use a less toxic (or nontoxic antifouling) paint.

Dispose of hazardous waste properly. This includes paints, batteries, antifreeze, cleaning products, oil, oil filters, and other hazardous waste.

Clean Boating Tips #8-10

Stow it, don't throw it.

Keep your trash on board and out of the water.

Use bilge and sewage pump out stations. Available at all harbors in the Monterey Bay Sanctuary.

Minimize Impacts. It is illegal to discharge raw sewage within the 3-mile territorial limit.

The Central Coast Marine Protected Areas



Marine Protected Areas allow fish and wildlife to reproduce without threats. This creates spillover of adult fish into the bay, which improves fishing for the future. Know the rules before you head out. Each MPA has specific rules and regulations! Visit californiampas.org and dfg.ca.gov/marine/mpa.





Sanctuary Regulations

- Violation of Sanctuary regulations is punishable by civil penalties of up to \$140,000 per day of violation.
- In addition to fines, violators may also be required to pay for emergency response, environmental damage, and remediation costs.
- Any property involved in a violation (e.g. boats, equipment, tools) may be seized and held by enforcement officials, pending legal action.
- Interference with a Sanctuary enforcement investigation or officer is a criminal offense.

Most Common Violations

1. Take of marine mammals or seabirds
2. Discharge
3. Seabed alteration
4. Unauthorized MPWC operation
5. Attempt to remove MBNMS resources
6. Permit violation
